## Our Blood Drive was Successful

Donna Klar was the leadoff donor at 7 a.m.  
on the morning of our pancake breakfast,

with 16 more to follow. During that 3-hour period a total of 17 donors were processed at the bloodmobile. Several persons who wanted to give blood turned out to be ineligible on that particular day.

Jennifer Bosler, head of the Carmel Bloodcenter, sent us this e-mail: "Thank you so much for a successful blood drive. We had a total of 17 blood donations! Each unit of blood can be broken down into three different components and go to three different hospital patients. That means that through your help and hard work and the generosity of volunteer donors, you were able to touch 51 lives!"

We did our good deed for the community that day, and we also helped keep them from going hungry. Dick Klar reported that our pancake breakfast net proceeds were \$1,058, which included \$492 from pre-sales—which is the real key to our success with this event. Income from the sale of advertising on the placements came to \$1,400. These will be used again at the fall breakfast.

Dick also reported that there were a total of 17 members participating, accounting for 71 hours of labor. We were, however, short on helpers, and attention needs to be put on beefing up our member attendance at the next event.

## April Board Minutes

*Treasurer's Report* – Balances as of March 31, 2007 were: Administrative Account \$944.57, Service Account \$5,496.80 for a total of \$6,441.37. It was reported our net profit from the Pancake Breakfast was \$1,074.38. No motion to approve due to lack of a quorum.

*Scholarship Applications* – We have received 2 applications for scholarships so far, both from Westfield High School students. The deadline for applications is April 10<sup>th</sup>.

Westfield Key Club would like us to participate in two upcoming events as supporters. The first event is on Saturday May 12<sup>th</sup> from 7:30 -9:30 a.m. serving breakfast at Ronald McDonald House. On May 19<sup>th</sup> the club is participating in a 5K Cystic Fibrosis Walk at Military Park. John Woods has packets for anyone interested in walking and raising money. Our role as a club would be primarily as “chaperones”.

*Sheridan Pancake Breakfast* –The Westfield Key Club has asked if they could help with this event. Dick will check with the Sheridan Club. They haven't indicated they need any additional help, but it might be a good experience for the Key Club.

*New Member Dues*- The District Governor has suggested that all clubs collect the \$53.00 International and District New Member fees when a new member joins the club, but delay collecting dues until the next annual billing. 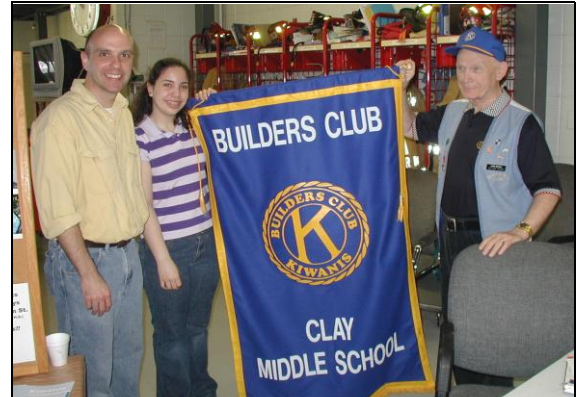


John Woods reports that Carmel High School Key Club has elected Officers and directors for 2007-08.
