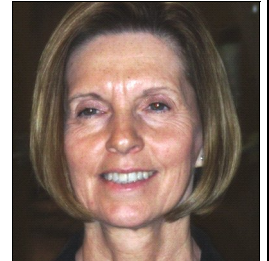
They will be installed in late September at our annual installation dinner.

Carmel Senior Wins Sycamore South Division Scholarship

Stefanie K. Wolf was the recipient of this year's division scholarship. Her application was submitted by our club along with one from Westfield High School. Among Stefanie's credentials is an SAT score of 1900 and a grade point average of 4.0128 (not a typo). She has a long list of outside activities, too numerous to mention here.

Stefanie plans to enter Indiana Univ. this fall and work for an undergraduate degree in biology, then attend the IU Medical School to study to become a surgeon.

Only one application per high school may be submitted, and the competition is among all Kiwanis clubs in the division. Selection is made by the District Scholarship Committee, and only clubs that contribute \$3 per member are eligible to submit applications. This award is independent of the two scholarships that our club will be presenting in June, one each to a student from Carmel and Westfield high school.

Also yet to be decided is the food to be served. Two of our members (Jeff Veldof and Myron Frank) together donated \$100 toward purchase of the food. The event could honor as many as 100 students. Since this is our first BUG event we are learning as we go along. It is expected that it will be expanded in the future.

♦*Scholarship program:* Still to be determined will be the two winners, one each from Carmel and Westfield. John Woods reports that so far only one or two applications have been received from each school.

♦*Interclubs:* At Monday morning's meeting Dave Harden asked for a volunteer to head up the club's interclub program. So far, there are no takers. Anyone interested? The current size of our club requires that an interclub group consist of four members.
