•*Farmers' market:* Jeff reported everything is set for Saturday and his team is ready to work. It was agreed that we need to display water bottles in a bucket of ice to increase sales. Chris also suggested the club keep track of each team's profit on a weekly basis, to promote a more competitive spirit and increase our profits. He agreed to take on this project.

•*State Fair:* Paul will get more information on this fundraising opportunity.

•*Carmelfest parade:* We missed the deadline by 2 days. However, Paul agreed, at the direction of the Board, to try applying online anyway. The theme this year is "America the Beautiful."

•*New banner stands:* The Set-up Committee has requested we purchase 3 replacement stands for our banners. The board approved making \$330 available to purchase them at \$110 each.
