**Eddie Pendoski** came to us by way of our website. He and wife **Lana** have lived in the Carmel area for two years.

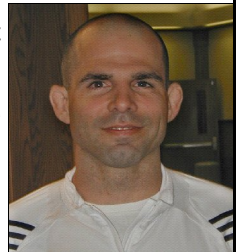
They are expecting their first child in August. Hometown for Eddie is Merrillville, and he graduated from Purdue University. Lana is an attorney.

membership increase. This would entitle our club to a dues refund (less individual member insurance assessment and magazine) on the new members. This money would then be placed in our service account.

♦**Old Business:** We still don't have a chair of the **Carmelfest Parade** committee. However, the board felt it is important for our club to have a presence in this year's parade. Mary said we could always walk the parade making it easier to pass out candy, as we aren't allowed to throw it. We could carry our club banner. It was also discussed that we could use an old car or fire truck with our banner displayed. Dick will check with Terry Prather, a former member of our club, about using one of his fire trucks if available.

♦**New Fund Raiser scheduled for September 2007** thanks to the efforts of Paul Felix. The paperwork has been submitted to sell CAR WASH coupons for an Express Wash at **Mike's Car Wash**. We ordered 250 personalized car wash coupons and will only have to pay a small up front cost of \$69 for the custom printing on the tickets. We have one month (September) to sell the coupons and we get to keep half the proceeds from the sale. Each car wash is sold at retail for \$7. We have the potential to make (approx) \$800 if all the tickets are sold.

♦**New Business: Camp Healing Tree** – This is the second year that our club will do this as a service project. Camp Healing Tree is a Bereavement Camp for children in central Indiana that have lost someone significant in their lives. Jeff Veldhof participated last year as a buddy (camp counselor). This year's camp is the weekend of our garage sale, August 24-26<sup>th</sup> and will be held at Camp Jameson on the west side of Indianapolis. Hank Starkey has also expressed an interest in participating this year. The board approved a \$1,000 contribution to Camp Healing Tree this past year with the 2006/2007 budget.

♦**Emergency Information Service Project** – Jeff presented a new service project that can be implemented during our pancake breakfasts, garage sale and other community events with little additional time commitment. It involves an Emergency Info Sheet to be completed and kept in the freezer (Wal-Mart used to have a program called "Vile of Life"). A magnet is then put on the refrigerator door that says, "Emergency Info – (Check Freezer). On the bottom third of the magnet it says, "Compliments of" with our Kiwanis International logo and club website. This program would be two-fold, first to help people prepare for an emergency and second to build brand awareness with our logo and website on refrigerators throughout the Hamilton County area. The board approved a motion by Dick Klar to present the program to the club at next Monday's business meeting to determine whether or not we proceed with this project.

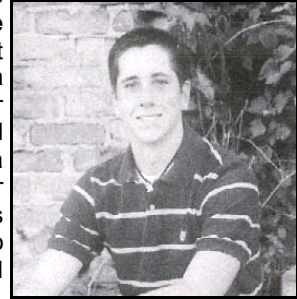
♦**Max & Erma's** - Paul mentioned that we can schedule another fundraiser at Max & Erma's in October. He will get back to the club with a date as soon as available.

♦A motion was made by Dick Klar that our club proceed with setting up a **501 C (3) Foundation for our Scholarship Fund**. Myron Frank and Dick Klar will handle all the paperwork for this. This was seconded by Paul Felix and approved unanimously by the board. A separate board will have to be established at a later date to oversee this foundation.
