## Book Project Needs Donations

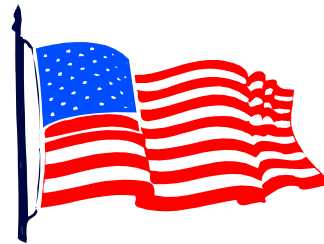
