Your Board of Directors met August 3<sup>rd</sup> with 9 members in attendance. Here are the highlights:

**Treasurer's Report:** Dick reported that we earned \$2397 from the Farmer's Market and \$463 from the Riley Jars. Dick took a \$3,000 check to District Convention for Riley Hospital. We have 3 more groups to pay this fiscal year: Chaucie's Place, Ronald McDonald House, and our Boy Scout Troop.

**Fundraisers:** As noted above, the Fall Pancake Breakfast is October 3<sup>rd</sup>. We raised the ticket price to \$5 for advance sales and \$6 at the door.

Jeff Lawrence is checking on the possibility of a game ball raffle, and someone suggested that Jeff Veldhof might be interested in chairing a poinsettia sale fundraiser this year.

**BUG Program:** Belinda stated that the elementary school they were working with has implemented their own program to help improve grades, so a new school partner will be needed if we want to continue this one.

Sue Finkam and Connie Hunt attended the CLE session on July 25<sup>th</sup>. Juvenile Diabetes will be

Kiwanis' new fundraising initiative. The goal is to receive \$1,000 per club each year for the next four years.

A new budget will be proposed at September's Board meeting. We hope not to raise our club dues.

**Sponsored Youth:** A suggestion was made for our club to make a donation to our Boy Scout Troop in recognition of all their hard work at the Market this summer. The Boys and Key Clubbers have been lifesavers for us—we could not work the Market without them!
